In April 2020, only a month into the COVID-19 outbreak in our state, the Hawai'i Lodging & Tourism Association joined forces with the Hawai'i Tourism Authority and Hawai'i Visitors and Convention Bureau to offer complimentary hotel stays to first-responders and healthcare workers courageously toiling in the frontlines of the pandemic. That effort, called "Hotels for Heroes," included 35 hotels that would provide more than a thousand room nights for these guests, many of whom were overworked and afraid of exposing their families to the virus.



Then, in September 2021, with the Delta variant now straining the state's medical capacity, the Hawai'i Lodging & Tourism Association introduced "Hotels for Healthcare Heroes," to offer two-night staycations for local doctors, nurses, and clinical staff battling the pandemic. This partnership with the

Healthcare Association of Hawai'i was made possible through the generosity of HLTA member-hotels across the state.

"Hotels for Healthcare Heroes" ran the weekend of September 17 to the end of October. Participants were selected by hospital administrators who worked directly with HLTA and the Healthcare Association of Hawai'i.

A total of 64 hotels across the Hawaiian Islands stepped forward to participate, welcoming the dedicated corps of healthcare heroes for a respite from their demanding responsibilities. In all, 715 professionals representing 34 hospital groups, enjoyed staycations totaling 1,430 room nights.

Mahalo to our HLTA member-hotels and their dedicated employees for helping to demonstrate the hospitality industry's gratitude to the healthcare professionals who are protecting and caring for us during this crisis.
