31st ANNUAL NA PO'E PA'AHANA AWARDS RETURNS AFTER THREE-YEAR HIATUS

Event recognizes the best in the hospitality industry

HONOLULU — It's back! After being on hiatus for three years due to the pandemic, the annual Na Po'e Pa'ahana Awards returned as in-person event yesterday at the Sheraton Waikiki, to honor hospitality industry professionals who have excelled in their respective fields. Organized by the Hawai'i Lodging & Tourism Association, this yearly event gives a chance for Hawai'i's tourism industry to recognize employees who embody the spirit of Aloha that our state is known for.

"I'm very pleased to see everyone gather for this long-awaited awards ceremony, often known as the Oscars of Hawai'i's visitor industry. It gave our members the opportunity to reconnect with their peers, and celebrate the accomplishments of our many awardees," said HLTA President and CEO Mufi Hannemann. "Amidst the devastating Maui wildfires in August that ravaged our state and had a direct impact on several of this year's award nominees, witnessing the unity among members of our tourism industry is truly uplifting. The collective support they've shown for each other is remarkable."

This year's awards garnered nearly 250 nominees from various hotels statewide. Two of the most coveted awards were "Manager of the Year" and "Most Outstanding Lodging Employee of the Year," with the following winners announced:

- Manager of the Year: Nani Kaina, Director of Housekeeping, Wailea Beach Resort
- Most Outstanding Lodging Employee of the Year: Cathy Troy, Executive Administrative Assistant, Sheraton Waikiki

Irene Pacheco, a laundry attendant from Hilo Hawaiian Hotel, received a standing ovation when she was announced as the Small Property Category winner for Housekeeper of the Year; now in her 90s, she has been in the hospitality industry for 53 years.

The Na Po'e Pa'ahana Awards also honored HLTA's Allied members who made substantial contributions to Hawai'i's tourism sector. Amongst the individual awards was the NPP Legacy Award, bestowed posthumously upon Danny Kaleikini for his lifelong dedication to enriching Hawai'i as an entertainer and ambassador of aloha. During the ceremony, Joni Albao, one of the original Kahala Sweetheart dancers from Danny's shows, paid tribute by performing to one of Danny's beloved songs, "Hula Eyes."
